For the 2024-25 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student subgroup in 2023-24. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2023-24. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or had a graduation rate at or below 67% in 2023-24. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Our school has been given none of these labels.

Principal Overview:

Mill Creek Academy is a public school academy that is authorized by Elk Rapids Schools. Currently, there are approximately 235 children from Kindergarten through fifth grade. We also offer a tuition-based preschool program and a Great Start Readiness Preschool program (GSRP). The school employs 11 K-5 classroom teachers; 3 certified support teachers for art, music, and physical education, 2 certified special education/intervention teachers; and 5 certified support staff members. Through a partnership with the health department, we are able to offer a full-time social worker to support students and classrooms. Free and reduced lunch rates averaged approximately 38% over the last 2 years.

Mill Creek Academy relies heavily on a strong parent-teacher organization, positive community partnerships, and extensive volunteer support. Our teachers strive to challenge every child at his/her level through using student-centered learning and high levels of engagement. Mill Creek Academy values social and emotional learning as an important asset in becoming productive citizens and lifelong learners. Our students engage in a variety of extracurricular learning opportunities including Robotics, clubs, and athletics. Our students are also engaged in leadership opportunities such as the Student Council.

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Status of the School Improvement Plan: Mill Creek Academy takes seriously the school improvement planning process as identified by the Michigan Department of Education.
